Practice Protocol: Bunion

Nature: Pain with ROM of 1st MPJ, Medial Bump Pain, Pain in Shoes, Abduction of Great Toe

Location: Medial 1st MPJ

Onset: Biomechanical, Progressive

Aggravating Factors: Walking, Tight Shoes, Exercise, Foot Type

Treatments: Wider Shoes, NSAIDs, Ice, Splints, Pads

Clinical Findings:

- 1. Hypermobile 1st Ray
- 2. Abduction of Hallux
- 3. Prominent Medial Eminence
- 4. Pain/Deviation with ROM of 1st MPJ
- 5. Decreased ROM on WB
- 6. Pain under the 2nd MPJ

Radiographic Findings:

- 1. IM angle
 - a. Mild Deformity: 8-10 degrees
 - b. Moderate Deformity: 10-14 degrees
 - c. Severe Deformity: over 14 degrees
- 2. Hallux Abductus Angle (over 15 degrees)
- 3. Tibial Sesamoid Position
- 4. 1st Met (cysts, erosion of cartilage, decreased joint space)
- 5. 2nd Met (length, cortical thickening)

Our Treatment Options

Conservative

- 1. Accommodative Shoes/Aperture Pads
- 2. Custom Orthotics/OTC Insoles
- 3. Bunion Splints
- 4. NSAIDS, Steroid Injections, Ice, Biofreeze

<u>Surgical</u>

- 1. Joint Preserving: Austin/Akin, Scarf Bunionectomy, Lapidus (severe deformity)
- 2. Joint Destructive: Keller, 1st MPJ Fusion, 1st MPJ Implant
